For more than 35 years, Washington Physicians Health Program (WPHP) has been Washington's trusted resource for restoring the health of medical professionals. Our confidential support and exceptional outcomes provide reassurance of safe practice and promote workforce sustainability. WPHP is an independent physician-led, nonprofit organization.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

WPHP offers early intervention, assessment, treatment referral, and post-treatment health support for those in the medical workforce with conditions that may negatively impact practice performance. In some cases, brief assessment and referral to services are all that is needed to support health and put concerns at rest. In other cases, more help is needed and WPHP is ready to assist. Referrals to WPHP protect the well-being of healthcare professionals and the patients they serve.

WPHP WORKS

- 92% of colleagues report that WPHP is a valuable resource to the medical community.
- 88% of colleagues would refer another colleague to WPHP.
- WPHP is highly effective with 87% of participants report needing and benefiting from WPHP advocacy.
- 86% of participants with substance use disorder remain abstinent at 5 years.
- 85% of participants are working in their field at program completion.
- And 84% of participants describe their WPHP experience as helpful or lifesaving.
